SRETENJE REPORT

The Serbian Ortodox Church and its followers are celebrating Sretenje. This is also Serbia's Statehood Day commemorating the First Serbian Uprising which started in Orasac in 1804. On Sretenje in 1835, the first democratic constitution of Serbia was adopted in Kragujevac - the Constitution of Sretenje.

We conducted a nationally representative survey which included a sample of 1192 respondents (95% confidence interval and marginal error ± 2.8%). We asked the public what they think about the Karadjordjevic Royal Family and whether they would support the restoring a parliamentary monarchy in Serbia.

The rest (54,5%) said they do not have an opinion on this topic.

The number of those who do not support the restoration of a parliamentary monarchy is lower in rural (14.2%) than in urban areas (22.4%).

However, the majority is neutral about the issue.

In urban areas, there is a more positive attitude about the Royal Family (40.1%) than in rural areas (37.9%). More positive attitudes prevail in the south (41.6%) and west of Serbia (41%) compared to Belgrade (39.5%) and northern Serbia (36.2%).

Men (42%) have a more positive attitude towards the Royal family than women (37.2%). More than 50% of women are neutral on this topic.

Men are more interested than women in the restoration of the monarchy, and 32.8% of them state that they would support that act, while only 17.9% of women state the same.

When the results are broken down geographically, by region, support/opposition to restoration are mostly similar. Half of the public don't have an opinion, while others are both for and against.
